Organisation of the drafting of the Strategic Plan

- 1st phase: SWOT analysis and needs assesment
- 2nd phase: Intervention strategy

Method

- **MAPA** (Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food) leads the work and is responsible for planning, designing and the inclusion in the CAP SP of the national interventions and of the common characteristics/definitions of interventions (national and regional).
- **The regions (Comunidades Autónomas)** are responsible for planning, designing and the inclusion in the CAP SP of the regional interventions.
- Continous meetings organised with the 17 regional governments at technical and political level for coordination and co-decision.
- Continous meetings also organised with external stakeholders.

Timeline for programming the CAP



1st phase: SWOT and needs assessment

Finalised

2nd phase: Development of the intervention strategy

- Priorisation and classification of needs (to justify the interventions chosen)
- Design of the intervention strategy, responding to the following questions: which interventions, to what needs do they correspond, the corresponding budget allocation, and how to design its implementation, management and control.
 - First pillar interventions: planned and designed at national level
 - Second pillar interventions: planned and designed at regional level

SWOT & Needs Assessment



- Developed based on 10 working groups led by MAPA, corresponding to the nine CAP specific objectives and the horizontal objective.
- For each of the 10 objectives, 4 documents have been developed: 1) The current situation/point of departure; 2) a SWOT analysis; 3) a needs assessment; 4) an executive summary – all publicly available. This work was finalised by end of 2020.

The development of the CAP SP has involved contributions from: the ministry of ecological transition and demographic challenges; the 17 regional public authorities; and agricultural, agri-food and environmental interest organisations (12 in total)

- 2) partnership meetings (3 meetings organized between December 2018 and December 2020).

CAP Interventions



- 1st: Priorisation and classification of needs
- 2nd: Design of the intervention strategy
- MAPA (Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food) designs national interventions and common elements (such as definition of genuine farmer, eligible agricultural area, capping, young farmers, conditionality, etc.)
- The regional authorities designs regional intervention, mostly RD interventions.
- The work for the 2nd phase is based on numerous technical documents, publicly available, relating to for ex: application of reinforced conditionality, eco-schemes, genuine farmers, decoupled payments, contribution to environmental and climate goals etc.
